## COUNCIL'S SCALP BOUNTY PROGRAM


Lockyer Valley Regional Council accepts wild dog/dingo scalps of animals caught in the Lockyer Valley for a bounty of \$25. This bounty program is offered year-round to support landholders in their efforts to minimise the impacts of pest animals.

## **HOW TO CLAIM A BOUNTY**

Location and day/time for collection for wild dog/dingo scalps must be pre-arranged with a Council Pest Management Officer. Scalps cannot be accepted at Council's customer service counters.

Payment for scalps is made by direct deposit after completing the application form.

Landholders must sign an application form upon submission indicating the lot and plan of the property where the animal was destroyed.

## **SCALP REQUIREMENTS**

Wild dog/dingo scalps and skin pieces are to be provided to Council individually as shown in the diagram below.

The Scalp must be:

- one whole single piece of skin and fur from the snout, including the ears, along the back to the tail end.
- air dried, frozen or fresh and preserved in a manner that allows for identification (i.e. flat)
- no frozen blocks of scalps or rotting scalps will be accepted
- scalps submitted in batches must be separated individually for identification and counting
- Council reserves the right to reject material submitted for the bounty if it does not meet the specified conditions

Animals should be destroyed by a qualified operator in accordance with the *Animal Care and Protection Act 2001*.
